Bandar-e-Khamir Fringe-toed Lizard

Global range: Iran.

Distribution in Iran: Hormozgan Province.

Biology: The Bandar-e-Khamir Fringe-toed Lizard was first collected in 2013 in limestone mountains and their slopes without vegetation or covered with scattered bushes. This lizard hides within these bushes when it feels itself in danger. There is little information about the biology of this species.



Size: Snout–vent length 48.5 mm, tail length 92 mm.

Activity pattern: Diurnal.
